#6 – CUSTOMERS ARE HONORING OUR PICKET LINES

• *Crain's Detroit Business* reported, "Costs from the strike are piling up, including lost tax revenue for the city and canceled events at the casinos." The National Kidney Foundation moved its ball away from MotorCity and the Detroit Downtown Partnership moved its annual Detroit Aglow fundraiser away from MGM.

#7 – THE STRIKE IS COSTING THE CASINOS MILLIONS

 Gaming revenues were down <u>\$20 million</u> in October compared to last year – it was the lowest month for Detroit casinos since December 2020 when casinos were shut down for most of the month because of COVID restrictions.
